## PHIL 1135

**Philosophy East & West, 3 Credits**  
**(Spring Semester 2010—**ONLINE** COURSE)**

This is a three-credit course in comparative philosophy. It aims to describe and compare the foundations of the philosophical traditions of East and West. Focus is on ancient China and Greece and applying knowledge of those traditions to better understand the global dynamics of the present-day world. Myth, religion, and the classical periods of both traditions are explored. Specific schools of philosophy and individuals introduced include Confucianism, Taoism, Legalism, and Buddhism in China, and the Pre-Socratics, Socrates, Plato, and Aristotle in Greece.

This course is taught in English. There is no prerequisite for this course. However, as this is an **online course**, students must have access to the Internet (at home, in IHCC library, etc.).

**This course can be used to satisfy the following requirements in Inver Hills Community College degree programs.**

1. 'Minimum of 60-semester credits numbered 1000 or above' needed to graduate.
2. **Liberal Arts Elective** requirement for Associate in Arts Degree, Associate in Science Degree, Associate in Applied Science Degree, and Associate in Fine Arts Degree; and **Liberal Arts Curriculum** in A.S. in Global Studies.
3. **Minnesota Transfer Curriculum**, Goal 6b (Humanities & Fine Arts) & Goal 8 (Global Perspectives).
